From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

On the third week of Easter I have been asking the Lord for the grace to live in the joy and hope of the Resurrection. It is too easy to take for granted all that we have been given in our faith and so I know I need to reclaim a more authentic and real desire to live not consumed with passing concerns but to live in the reality of how Jesus has offered me the gift of eternal life and grace in this life.

One of the ways that I do this is by praying for peace. Peace is not simply the absence of conflict, but the total order of our lives to tranquility that comes from God. When we order our lives with God first and at the center there is the opportunity for our hearts to remain in peace even while many things seek to rob that peace that comes from God. It is a firm foundation—a steady ground—that we can stand on and remain confident in God's plan and purpose for us.

In these spring days our schedules fill up quickly and we can run from one thing to the next. Yet, I hope you see beyond the busyness of how much God is at work in your life. Don't become too busy or rushed for the things that really matter. Let yourself enjoy life and its beauty, its love, and its joy even despite times of trial or hardship. I pray the Lord in His abundant grace will protect and sustain you and your family.

Next Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday and the 51st World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Please pray for an increase of priestly vocations in our Diocese.

O God, Who wish all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of Your truth: send, we beg You, laborers into Your harvest, and grant them grace to speak Your word with all boldness:

so that Your word may spread and be glorified, and all nations may know You, the only God, and Him Whom You have sent, Jesus Christ Your Son, Our Lord, Who lives and reigns world without end. Amen.
