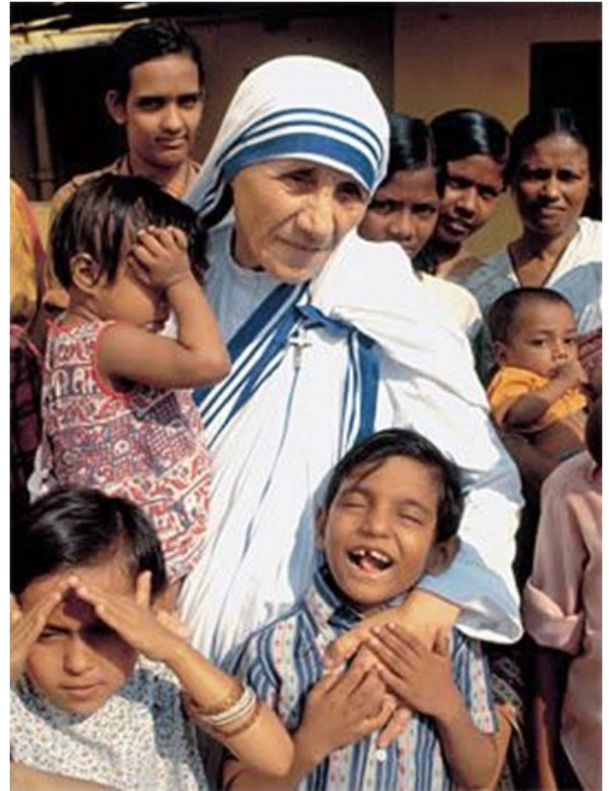

From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Thank you to each of you for the support and encouragement you have given to me over last week's announcement about lawsuits against the Diocese and St. Teresa and St. Joseph. I hope that each of you received my letter in the mail this week. If you have further questions please contact me anytime to discuss what all this means. It is my understanding that the primary reason the parishes are named in these lawsuits is an attempt to gather insurance liability coverage into the lawsuits. The parish itself had no say over which priest was appointed and would be very difficult to prove any liability against the parish. We have had communication meetings with the lawyers representing the majority of parishes in the diocese to understand the nature of these lawsuits and I will communicate further information as it pertains to our parishes should it become available. Thanks for your patience and understanding in all of this. It is of course likely that this will unfold in the coming year or more and so our continued patience and prayers will be demanded. Most especially, pray for the victims who have been hurt by this—they are the ones hurting most. An additional question that has been raised and was asked in our meetings that I would like to make you aware of is that your gift to the Diocesan annual appeal (Catholic Ministries Appeal) is not used for lawyer fees nor would it be used in any way for anything other than what is named in the appeal itself to support the mission of the church. Donor intention is always a top priority and so if a money is designated to a specific purpose it can and will only be used for that purpose. The same is certainly true in our Tri-Parish.

Enough for now about lawsuits. If you do have further questions please feel free to email or call me directly. Carol Cyr, our Tri-Parish manager (along with a Trustee from each parish), also attended the meeting and can clarify confusion or questions.

I am announcing an exciting opportunity for our parishioners this weekend! I wanted to take a special pilgrimage for the Tri-Parish for the Year of Mercy. Fr. Andrew Vogel from the Easton/MN Lake/Wells Cluster and I are planning a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help this summer which is the only approved apparition site in North America. The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared on these grounds over 150 years ago to Adele Brise and instructed her to teach the children in the faith. This is where Sister Adele began her work and inspired the efforts of generations of faithful Christians. We will travel June 6-7th with a stop at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in La Crosse and the national shrine of St. Joseph as well. These will be two great days that will be filled with grace. I hope you will plan to join us on the pilgrimage.

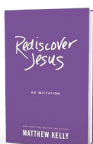
