From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Next Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King and the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time. We have

already reached the cusp of Advent and our immediate preparation for the Coming of the Lord. Christ the King is a favorite feast of mine as it celebrates Jesus' final victory over the world. He reigns at the right hand of the Father and will come again to judge the living and the dead. On November 20th the Solemnity of Christ the King we will also formally conclude the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in the Catholic Church. This was a splendid year of grace and I am grateful for Pope Francis' vision to call forth mercy upon the Church and the whole world. While I wish we could have taken even more advantage of such a momentous ocean of grace, I hope you were able to reflect in your own life on the profound depths of mercy that we find in God. Created in love, Redeemed in love, Forgiven in love, and being led by love. Stay on the path of mercy that is before us by growing in frequency of the Sacrament of Confession, personal prayer, and frequency of the Mass.

Upcoming this month, I will take a personal retreat the week of Thanksgiving. The Church asks her priests to take a 5 day retreat each year and I have typically done mine in the fall of the year. It has gotten a little later than I would prefer this year and so I scheduled it on a week where the Newman Center slows down and even in the parishes it is reasonable to sneak away. I am not planning to miss a weekend for it but will be away during that week. This means that there will be no Thanksgiving Day Mass in the parish. If you would like to attend one to give thanks to God, Easton has a large Thanksgiving Day Mass as a wonderful custom in their parish. The Mass is at 10am that morning. Please keep me in your prayers next week.

As a Tri-Parish we continue to work toward implementing a program called Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This program will include 3-6 year olds (only) in its initial launch next fall with the potential to add ages in the future. We have two people who will be attending 90 hours of training from the Tri-Parish starting this winter and I am looking to ask a third person to attend the training if possible. I am very excited how God has brought about His will for this program to unfold in our parish. It will instill great opportunities for our young children to learn the faith at their level and pace. Instead of reading or just coloring pictures they will interactively learn in a setting appropriate to their place and ability in life. In the months ahead leading up to next fall we will be asking for help to build some classroom materials and items to establish a setting where the youth can grow and learn!

Thanks for the whole parish supporting this endeavor.
