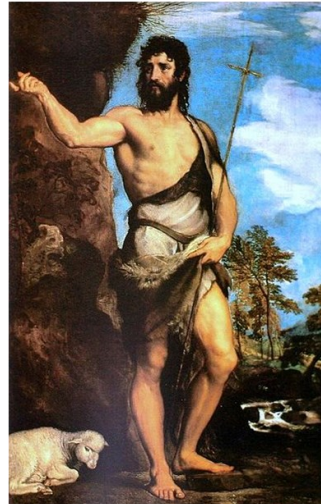

From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Come, let us adore Him! Next weekend we will have an hour of prayer asking the Lord for a deepening of our Catholic faith. From 11am-Noon we will have an hour of prayer including music to draw us deeper into the mystery of God's love and mercy. Next Sunday is Gaudete Sunday or Rejoice Sunday as we rejoice in the truth of our salvation drawing near. Our Savior is coming quickly and so to prepare our hearts we will have this time of prayer. I hope you might join us for this time to rejoice as a Tri-Parish in the gift of our Savior. Adoration will continue each Sunday of Advent from 10am-10pm and you are welcome to stop in at St. Teresa Church to pray anytime during the day to spend some quiet prayer with our Eucharistic Lord.

This Thursday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and is a holy day of obligation. This wonderful feast of our Lady reminds us of our call to purity as Mary, the Mother of Jesus is conceived in the womb of St. Anne her mother without the state of original sin that we are each born into. Original sin is the state of separation from God that because of the original fall of Adam and Eve all of humanity inherits this separation or state of guilt where we must be reconciled back to God through baptism. This inherited guilt needs to be wiped away and is done so by our baptism. Mary received what is called prevenient grace which prevented her from participating in the inherited guilt. It is only because of God's saving grace that she could be free from this contracted guilt. The purpose of this is that Mary would be given so noble a task as to give birth to our Savior. She needed to be pure to give birth to the Pure One. She needed to be holy—set apart—for the Holy One. It is fitting that God would enrich her who was to give birth to Him. The Scriptures call her "full of grace" when the angel announces she will give birth to the Messiah. And so we celebrate that Mary as All-Holy and redeemed in a singular, unique, and more exalted way by the infinite merits of her Son. This means that it is Mary who was born without the fallen state but also never committed personal sin. She is truly without sin. This means that Mary alone lived life without sin with only a human will ordered to God's plan and surrendering her life. Jesus Himself had both a human will and a divine will and so conformed His human will to the Divine Will. Mary in her humility and trust gave her human will completely in confidence to God's Will.

The season of Advent is a Marian season where we experience that desire to be like Mary—to ponder the mysteries in our heart and prepare to welcome Jesus and His grace more fully into our lives. When we welcome Mary into our hearts we welcome Jesus with her. Mary is a mother to us, an intercessor for us, and a queen to guide us toward the King. I pray that you might have a Marian Advent this year. A time of quiet trust and humility—surrendering our will to the Will of God. Mary, mother of the Church and mother of each of us, pray for me. Mary, who is conceived without sin, pray for us.

Friday, Dec. 9 is the feast of St. Juan Diego. On December 9, 1531, a native Mexican named Juan Diego rose before dawn to walk fifteen miles to daily Mass in what is now Mexico City. Juan lived a simple life as a weaver, farmer, and laborer. That morning, as Juan passed Tepeyac Hill, he heard music and saw a glowing cloud encircled by a rainbow. A woman's voice called him to the top of the hill. There he saw a beautiful young woman dressed like an Aztec princess. She said she was the Virgin Mary and asked Juan to tell the bishop to build a church on that site. She said, "I vividly desire that a church be built on this site, so that in it I can be present and give my love, compassion, help, and defense, for I am your most devoted mother . . . to hear your laments and to remedy all your miseries, pains, and sufferings."
