From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

As our children return to school this week and fall sports are well underway we begin again with the fall routine and the excitement of a fresh start. As many of us dread the cold that is nearing, this is still a beautiful time of year with new opportunities and adventures ahead. It was a very blessed summer for our parishes and now we are ready to dig in for another good year of faith formation and Confirmation prep just around the corner. Might we pray for one another that the transition of another year will begin well and filled with peace and safety.

Be reminded about the rotation of masses again next weekend. And as you plan your fall schedule, make a special mark for the Diocesan 125th Anniversary Celebration in two weeks on Friday September 12th and Saturday the 13th. On Saturday the 13th we will be canceling our evening mass at St. Teresa in order that we could gather with Bishop Quinn for the 4pm Mass at the Verizon Center in Mankato. It is a blessing that this event is so close to us as we often hear about these events either in the bulletin or by my speaking about them but we never really take advantage. Perhaps for different reasons like, it is too much effort to go into Mankato for this or I will just go Sunday morning because it's easier. Or it could be that I don't see it as worth my time for different reasons. However, if we saw ourselves more deeply connected to the Church—that is, our Bishop John Quinn is the direct successor to one of the 12 Apostles and is continuing the work of Christ and the Twelve in southern MN—the Diocese of Winona—today and therefore when the Bishop is present with his local Church, the whole Christ is present in His Body. The Diocese of Winona has been around for 125 years and amidst much negative news in recent years, continues to do wonderful work in sharing the Gospel and spreading the love of Christ in our modern and complicated world. It seems that too often we view the diocese more like a government who we pay money towards and who gives us laws than a spiritual Shepherd and facilitator of our ministries. The Diocese carries forth the work of the Bishop and the whole Church for us here on a local level and so I ask you to consider joining this celebration and Bishop Quinn in thanking God for the 125 years of faithful ministry in the Diocese. If you are indeed unable to make it, please pray for the success of this event, but I would love to see many of us there to enjoy the wonderful celebration and to see the local Church of the Diocese of Winona in full strength.

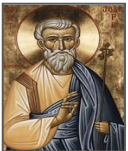

Special Collection for the Middle East

The relief needs of the persecuted Christians in the Middle East are tremendous.

Dioceses are being asked to provide aid for the immense humanitarian suffering and other urgent needs that have resulted from this crisis. These funds will be used by Catholic Relief Services and other Catholic agencies working in partnership with the local Church to meet the most urgent humanitarian needs facing the people in Iraq, Gaza, Syria and surrounding countries where refugees have fled.
