## From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

Epiphany, in my opinion, is the most important forgotten feast in the life of the Church today!

The Feast of Epiphany (meaning a sudden or profound meaning or understanding) celebrates the moment when the magi arrived at the manger with Jesus wrapped in swaddling clothes and bowed down in worship and presented their gifts as offerings to the Divine presence, to the one who would suffer, and to the one who is King. I say this day is a forgotten feast because we fail to recognize its significance in our day where we get swept up in the culture that says Christmas is long past. Christmas has just begun! The revealing of who Jesus truly is has now begun! These seekers from the Far East arrive and offer worship and homage to a baby! This is an unfolding of the reality that this child lying in a trough is the savior not just for Israel, but for the whole world—indeed for you and me. This is cause for exultation! Epiphany is one of the highest ranking feast days in the life of the Church and we tend to forget about it. This weekend, let us be reminded of our need to give homage to the Christ child and to bring our gifts to Him and lay them open before Him. The most precious gift we offer Jesus is the gift of ourselves in love.

Soon after the marvel of this spectacular day of the revelation of Jesus Christ to the world, the Holy Family will flee persecution and identify themselves with the thousands of martyrs as well as the thousands of people who have fled religious persecution or other forms of violence in their land. We pray in a particular way for Christians who are driven from their lands in many countries in our modern world as well as the many persons in our world who have fled for other reasons with hope of a better life in a distant land. This difficult decision to leave family and homeland comes at a great price and we as Christians have a duty to be there to welcome them.

Thank you for your welcome of Fr. Raymond Sorin a missionary priest who works in tandem with an organization called Food For the Poor. This organization is one of the largest international relief and development organizations in the nation and feeds millions of hungry people throughout the numerous countries they serve. Also, thank you for your prayers for me while I am away at the SEEK Conference with 10,000 college students and for each of us to be drawn to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ! I will be back early this week.

**The feast of manifestation, or Epiphany**, is traditionally celebrated the 12th day after Christmas, January 6th. In the dioceses of the United States this feast has been moved to the Sunday between January 2 and January 8.

For many years in the English speaking world the feast of Epiphany has been overshadowed by that of Christmas. But unless we realize the significance of this great day, we see only one side of the mystery of the Incarnation. Now after contemplating the staggering fact that God has become a human child, we turn to look at this mystery from the opposite angle and realize that this seemingly helpless Child is, in fact, the omnipotent God, the King and Ruler of the universe. The feast of Christ's divinity completes the feast of His humanity. It fulfills all our Advent longing for the King "who is come with great power and majesty." We see that whereas Christmas is the family feast of Christianity, Epiphany is the great "world feast of the Catholic Church."
