From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

This past Thursday we celebrated the Feast of St. Joseph, the faithful spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saint Joseph is recognized as the second most important saint in the Church as his role was so very important to the salvation of all mankind. We are blest to celebrate so noble a man who faithfully and humbly remained faithful to the will of God. Our Tri -Parish is blest to have St. Joseph as one of the patrons of our parish. We should grow in a deeper devotion to Joseph praying that we too might remain vigilant to do what God asks of us not for our own glory but only to remain faithful to God. My home parish in Owatonna is St. Joseph and so I have always felt a closeness with St. Joseph and found myself inspired by his faithfulness. The loyalty of Joseph to Jesus and Mary and to the will of God is incredible. St. Joseph: faithful, true, prudent, loyal, just, generous, hard-working, laborer, serene, confident, honest, humble, loving. What man doesn't desire to model their lives on these qualities that Joseph himself carried out. Pray for us oh faithful foster-father of our Savior!

This coming week on Wednesday the Church celebrates another feast day: The Annunciation of the angel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Notice the timing: The 25th of March: 9 months before Christmas! Obviously the Church is very intentional with her feast days and celebrating the life of devotion and faith. I think it is regrettable how much we have let go of the many devotions and prayers that have inspired our Catholic ancestors through the centuries. We have lost some of the practices that helped bring the faith alive in our homesteads. We have memories of family rosaries or of praying devotions to particular saints or litanies at certain points. In some parishes people gathered at the Church every week to pray devotions like Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Sacred Heart devotions, 40 hours devotion, prayers for the poor souls in purgatory, and on and on. Now we find these things laborious or ancient or we just think ourselves too busy to make the time for them. These practices aided in grace and moved hearts to a deeper love of God. I would recommend for the last couple weeks of Lent finding a saint or devotion that touches you and praying it each day during the week. I love praying the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Litany of St. Joseph, the Litany of Humility, or any other prayer or devotion that might enkindle a deeper love of God. We have a Church rich in tradition on prayer and devotions that have enkindled in the hearts of believers for centuries to live faithfulness and generous lives as we give of ourselves to God.
