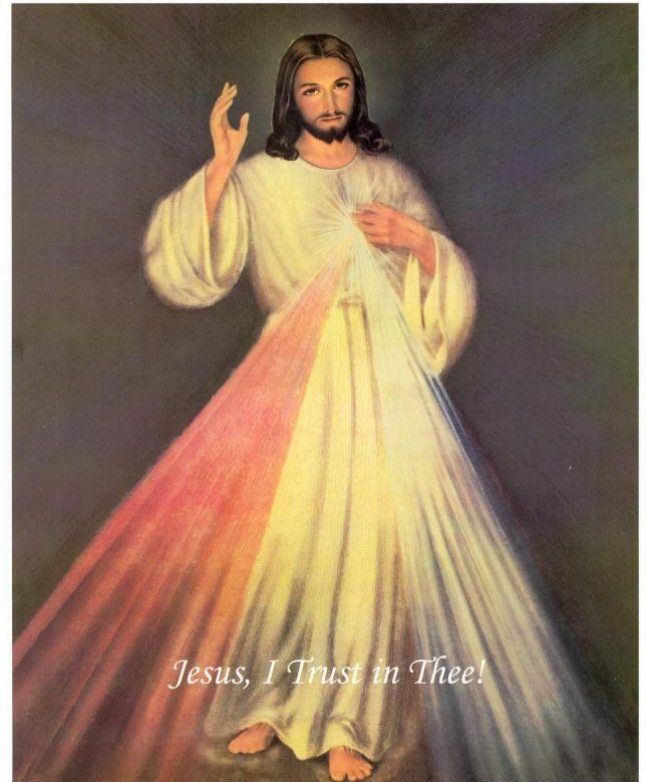

## From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

Read this quote from St. Faustina's Diary where she writes about her encounters with Jesus who revealed the Divine Mercy devotion to her; this quote is Jesus speaking to St. Faustina about the Feast of Divine Mercy:

*On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary 699)*

Incredible! We should never tire of the message of mercy and the depths of which the Father wants to reveal that mercy to human hearts. We should seek to experience this forgiveness in our lives and that is why Confession is such a powerful means of encounter with God. It is the ordinary encounter with the merciful and loving God who blots away our sins from the face of the earth. This Sunday celebrates the purpose Jesus came, to triumph over sin and death and to show His victory in the forgiveness of sins. How grateful I am as a sinner to know of this incredible ocean of mercy that is offered to me if only I avail myself to God in this manner! Thank you Jesus!

I would like to make one comment that is sort of an aside: This past week I had someone come and talk to me who was hurt by a decision that I made that affected them. The situation was really such that if we had conversed before the timeframe of the decision it could have easily been compromised or at least removed some of the tension surrounding the situation. I would just like to perhaps re-emphasize how open I am to this type of dialogue and would never intend to make someone feel like they either didn't have a voice or that I was attempting to manipulate a situation for my own gain. Please always feel invited to discuss situations with me and while I can't promise to compromise in every scenario (nor should I perhaps) I would invite the conversation so that communication and clarity can be established at the very least. I love being the pastor of these parishes and would never intend to isolate someone based on personal preference or situational decisions. Bless you all during these joyful Easter days!

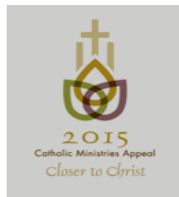
