From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

The Heavenly Ascension of our Lord is celebrated this weekend where Jesus left this earth to dwell at the right hand of the Father and perpetually intercede for all of humanity until He returns in glory. Though He departed this earth, our Lord did not leave us to ourselves. He promised and did indeed send an Advocate—a Helper—the Holy Spirit. I love calling upon the Holy Spirit—God’s very Presence and inviting Him to abide in me, to dwell with me, to console my heart. We are much more dependent on the Holy Spirit than we could ever give credit and as the Feast of the Holy Spirit—Pentecost—draws near I am reminded of the power and impact of calling upon the Holy Spirit in our day to day lives. Come to us, Spirit of God!

With the Holy Spirit comes newness, creativity, and a dynamism impossible if left to ourselves. We have all had those moments where we wonder why something happened to us, or what direction something might be going, or a frustration that we aren’t able to resolve but then it works itself out and only looking back do we see that God was at work; and not only at work but the entire thing helped us to grow and become stronger for the future. Providence is so real when we see with the eyes of faith and it is by living in the Spirit that we are able to see God at work both in looking back at the past or in the present moment. The Holy Spirit also helps us to trust that God will provide into the future. Blessed be the Holy Spirit of God—the third Person of the Blessed Trinity.

This weekend I invoke the Holy Spirit to aid us in grace and consoling love as we envision a new direction in some aspects of our parish ministries. I have been asked by Bishop Quinn to, in addition to remaining pastor of our Tri-Parish, become the pastor/Chaplain of the St. Thomas More Newman Center on a full time basis. I am working with the Tri-Parish staff, the Pastoral Councils in our Tri-Parish, and the Newman Center staff to work toward a manageable schedule and one that will enable effective pasturing in respect to all the demands regarding these assignments. I am confident that God will direct me to make the decisions that are most needed in order to effectively lead and delegate particular responsibilities where it is needed. I have accepted this assignment knowing that it will affect this Tri-Parish but also confident in the direction we are moving in our ministries. Thank you for your prayerful support throughout this transition.
