## From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

"These two weeks of June I am down in Omaha, NE at Creighton University at a summer program for seminarians called the Institute of Priestly Formation. This program is very encouraging as it trains 175 seminarians a year in the importance of establishing and maintaining amidst a busy lifestyle a personal relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. While it is always difficult to be away, I have felt a consistent call to be here and encourage the seminarians along their journey towards priesthood. I attribute much of my own personal growth and understanding of the depth of the spiritual life (though admittedly I have much to grow in yet) to my own experience as a seminarian at IPF. This week has already served as a reminder and renewed grace of the healing, love, and grace I received as well as the confirmation from the Father of my own vocation to the priesthood that happened in the summer of 2008 when I was here previously.

IPF promotes a simple yet profound spirituality that each of us could benefit from. The basic approach begins with this: -->We are in relationship to our loving God--Father, Son, & Holy Spirit -->From this relationship we learn our identity--who we are --beloved sons & daughters of God and how to relate to the world -->From this identity flows our mission in the world. Using the image of a three-legged stool, this approach shows that if any one of these three legs (Relationship-Identity-Mission) of the stool is distorted the stool will become wobbly and need to be adjusted.

This last Friday was the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Three years ago I was ordained on this Feast day and so this week I rejoice in the gift of my priesthood (three years ago it landed on the 15th of June). I am very happy and love being a priest and I love being your priest. This doesn't mean it is easy, but it is my relationship with Christ that is truly the cause of my joy.

Sharing in that joy our diocese celebrates the ordination of Deacon Jonathan Fasnacht to the priesthood this Friday, June 19th at 2:00pm at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Winona. Please keep Deacon Jonathan in your prayers this week (the secret might be out but he has been staying with me in the rectory for the last couple weeks as he gets all the details in order leading up to his ordination. It has been a privilege to walk with him up to the 19th. His many personal gifts will be a blessing to our diocese. Next Saturday I will attend his Mass of Thanksgiving and celebration to follow in Janesville and so a visiting priest will have the vigil mass that evening.
