

Sat., July 25 is the 47th Anniversary of Pope Paul VI Encyclical letter, *Humanae Vitae* (On Human Life)

From the encyclical:

The transmission of human life is a most serious role in which married people collaborate freely and responsibly with God the Creator. It has always been a source of great joy to them, even though it sometimes entails many difficulties and hardships.

Married love particularly reveals its true nature and nobility when we realize that it takes its origin from God, who "is love," (6) the Father "from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named." (7) Marriage, then, is far from being the effect of chance or the result of the blind evolution of natural forces. It is in reality the wise and provident institution of God the Creator, whose purpose was to effect in man His loving design. As a consequence, husband and wife, through that mutual gift of themselves, which is specific and exclusive to them alone, develop that union of two persons in which they perfect one another, cooperating with God in the generation and rearing of new lives.

Natural Family Planning Awareness Week is July 19 through July 25. The dates of this week highlight the anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love and responsible parenthood. "It is a scientific method, it's not the rhythm method or the calendar method — it works," said Karen Murphy Corr, provincial coordinator at Serena BC, which offers NFP services. "Women start to realize if I'm eating organic and I'm drinking out of glass, and I'm making all these efforts in every other aspect of my life, why would I manage my fertility with a carcinogen?"
