All Catholics need to meet with the priest or deacon at least 6 months before being married. Contact the office at least 6 months in advance of your wedding.



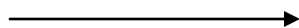
From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

I am very excited to welcome to our Tri-Parish this weekend Bishop Bernard Harrington, the retired bishop of the Diocese of Winona. While

I am away covering a wedding this weekend, Bishop Harrington graciously agreed to be here to cover our weekend masses. Bishop Harrington was the bishop of our diocese the entire time I was in college seminary and served as an inspiring mentor to me. One of the highlights of being a seminarian under Bishop Harrington is that he would use the seminarians to drive him to Confirmation liturgies. It was always a privilege to be able to ride with him and serve for him. The primary reason he did this (in my understanding) was that it provided him an opportunity to get to know on a personal level the men studying for the priesthood while also alleviating him from the rigors of the extensive driving that was required of his service to the diocese. I have told Bishop before that after every trip with him I always left with a deeper desire to be a priest and was inspired from the day or weekend. Bishop Harrington is originally from Detroit, MI but has been in the Diocese of Winona since 1999. We are very blessed to have had him serve our local Church and shepherd us over the years. Bishop Harrington continues to assist Bishop Quinn with Confirmation liturgies and was in Mapleton last fall for our Confirmation Mass. Thank you for your gracious welcome of Bishop Harrington.

September happenings: Please note the rotation of mass times in September which will switch to Saint Joseph at 5:00PM; St. Teresa at 8:00AM; and St. Matthew at 10:00AM but then also the weekend of September 12th/13th there will be no 5PM mass that Saturday as St. Joseph's will have their annual Festival in the Park following a noon mass on Sunday September 13th. Thanks for your flexibility and attention to these details. The Festival in the Park is a lot of fun and a wonderful parish festival for St. Joseph so thanks for joining us and celebrating that afternoon with us! I hope many from our Tri-Parish will join the fun that day!

Also in September, the United States Church is preparing to welcome Pope Francis September 22-27th. We should join in prayer for this event as a papal visit offers special graces as the United States Church celebrates and rallies around our faith to welcome the Holy Father. The Pope will come from Cuba to Washington, D.C. and go on to New York and finally Philadelphia while he is in the United States. Pope Francis coincided his visit with the World Meeting of Families happening in Philadelphia which is a conference that is seeking to support the family as the basic cell of human society and encourage families in their journey of faith. The conference seeks to explore the critical role the family plays in society and gives families a chance to talk about the many challenges and blessings they are faced with in the modern world.

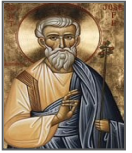

Stewardship means respecting and sharing our resources as an expression of gratitude to God. It reminds us that we are the administrators, not the owners, of our assets. Christian stewardship can be identified by several meaningful characteristics, the most important is that it strengthens our relationship with God. It is a way of life. Stewardship calls us to share a portion of our time, talent, and treasure so that the Good News of Jesus Christ may be shared with those who do not know Him.

Sunday Bible Reflections with Dr. Scott Hahn

Today's Gospel casts Jesus in a prophetic light, as one having authority to interpret God's law.

Jesus' quotation from Isaiah today is ironic (see [Isaiah 29:13](#)). In observing the law, the Pharisees honor God by ensuring that nothing unclean passes their lips. In this, however, they've turned the law inside out, making it a matter of simply performing certain external actions.

The gift of the law, which we hear God giving to Israel in today's First Reading, is fulfilled in Jesus' gospel, which shows us the law's true meaning and purpose (see [Matthew 5:17](#)).

The law, fulfilled in the gospel, is meant to form our hearts, to make us pure, able to live in the Lord's presence. The law was given that we might live and enter into the inheritance promised to us -- the kingdom of God, eternal life.

Israel, by its observance of the law, was meant to be an example to surrounding nations. As James tells us in today's Epistle, the gospel was given to us that we might have new birth by the Word of truth.

By living the Word we've received, we're to be examples of God's wisdom to those around us, the "first fruits" of a new humanity.

This means we must be "doers" of the Word, not merely hearers of it. As we sing in today's Psalm and hear again in today's Epistle, we must work for justice, taking care of our brothers and sisters, and living by the truth God has placed in our hearts.

The Word given to us is a perfect gift. We should not add to it through vain and needless devotions. Nor should we subtract from it by picking and choosing which of His laws to honor.

"Hear me," Jesus says in today's Gospel. Today, we're called to examine our relationship to God's law.

Is the practice of our religion a pure listening to Jesus, a humble welcoming of the Word planted in us and able to save our souls? Or are we only paying lip-service?
