## From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

I would just like to share a little bit with you about how encouraged I am by God's grace and love in my ministry. This week, like not just a few weeks with my new schedule, has been full, but a couple times a month on Tuesday I am gifted to teach RCIA to around 15 people. This week the topic was virtues and vices and we investigated the reality of how each of us can grow by forming those good habits in our life and avoiding the ones that do us harm. Virtues enable us to live the good life that truly makes us happy. We form those disciplines of life to do what is truly good for us and others. Lord, help me to keep choosing those habits which help me grow closer to you!

After RCIA on Tuesday night, I host a Discernment Group for 12 young men at the Newman Center who are discerning the priesthood. A few of them are confident God is calling them to priesthood and a few of them are dating so we can see that each guy's journey is unique but we gather twice a month and eat pizza (as a group we are also discerning the best pizza in Mankato). Father Will Thompson, the Vocations Director for the diocese, often joins us as we use a booklet on prayer to learn more about our own prayer lives as the basis for all authentic discernment or following of God's will. This is a great gift to journey with these young men in their life choice of how God is calling them.

Perhaps the highlight of my week came on Wednesday night! We held a praise and worship event called Revive at the Newman Center. We gathered at 7pm in the Chapel and had Eucharistic Adoration along with praise and worship music to draw our hearts to the Lord. We had over 60 college students who came to worship Jesus and go to confession. It is truly remarkable to see God at work in so many people's lives. I am humbled to be able to be an agent of grace and find myself in awe of the wondrous mysteries of God drawing us to Himself. I am truly grateful to be His priest.

After talking with the finance councils of each of our parishes, I am close to finding someone to help me in a temporary position as youth activities director. This will be a temporary position for this year where the person will assist me in coordinating with parents about youth group activities, planning the activities, and helping put on the event. One of the areas that we have worked hard the past couple years is building a youth program that is fun and meaningful to our youth. I do not want to lose momentum just because I am less present and unable to follow through on as many details as I would have in the past. This person will be available to help me with the ordinary tasks of organization and follow through. Please keep this in your prayers.

**Monday, November 2 is All Souls Day.** The Roman Catholic celebration is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification and moral perfection, a requirement for entrance into Heaven. This sanctification is carried out posthumously in Purgatory. **We will celebrate a special Mass on Monday, Nov. 2, to pray for the Faithful Departed at 7 p.m. at St. Teresa.**
