

From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

All hail Christ the King! This week the Church celebrates the final Sunday in Ordinary Time and in so doing celebrates it by recognizing Jesus'

authority over all time and place. Jesus is your savior and mine. You are in need of Jesus both now and forever. I always love this feast day where I renew my own desire to keep Jesus as the ruler of my life, of my heart, and of our whole world. May Jesus' reign be renewed in a world of violence and discord. A title for Jesus is the King of Peace. The Catechism says this:

"Peace is not merely the absence of war, and it is not limited to maintaining a balance of powers between adversaries. Peace cannot be attained on earth without safeguarding the goods of persons, free communication among men, respect for the dignity of persons and peoples, and the assiduous practice of fraternity. Peace is the "tranquility of order." Peace is the work of justice and the effect of charity. (2304)"

By the blood of His Cross, He reconciled men with God and made his Church the sacrament of unity of the human race and of its union with God. He is our peace and has declared Blessed are the peacemakers (2305).

With this being the final week of Ordinary Time, we will begin Advent and our preparations for the coming of Jesus next weekend. I offer a reminder and two practical items for your Advent beginnings: First, in every Advent we prepare for the three comings of Jesus. First, we prepare our hearts to welcome Jesus born into this world on Christmas morning. This day we celebrate Jesus taking on human flesh and uniting God to us by becoming one with us. The second coming of Jesus we celebrate is into our own hearts. In this coming we welcome Jesus more fully into our lives by inviting Him to reign as Savior over us and unite us to the Father by living in Him. The third coming we prepare for during Advent is Jesus' return at the end of time when He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. This is why we celebrate the first two comings so that we are fully prepared for the third or final coming of Jesus. Come Lord Je-
