These will be the spiritual benefits and graces attributed to our Tri-parish because of Eucharistic Adoration:

- an increase in Mass attendance and reception of the sacraments;
- return of fallen-away Catholics and increase in the number of conversions;
- increase in religious and priestly vocations; renewal of Catholic family life;
- spiritual level of the people is raised with a resulting desire and courage to spread the "good news" to others; a greater community spirit, centered as it is on the heart of the parish: Jesus' presence in the Blessed Sacrament.

Pope John Paul II said: “Your faith will help you to realize that it is Jesus Himself who is present in the Blessed Sacrament, waiting for you and calling you to spend one hour with Him each week.”

The visit to the Blessed Sacrament is a great treasure of the Catholic faith. Through Eucharistic Adoration we proclaim to our parish and to our community that Jesus is here, truly present among us today. Most adorers say that seeing Jesus so close to them under the appearance of the Sacred Host is very intimate. When you come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, He appreciates this so deeply that you release the power of His love and graces to all of His children. The time of prayer brings joy to our hearts and helps us to grow in holiness. One of our parishioners remarked to me last year that “My hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the most peaceful, the most satisfying hour of my week. I always feel refreshed and renewed.” And the grace that flows from the time we spend with Christ can spread out into our community as we pray for conversions and the return of fallen-away Catholics. “We cannot underestimate the power of prayer and the difference it will make in our world.” (Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta)

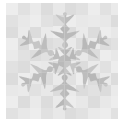
Come explore the biblical story of God's great outpouring of love and mercy in the person of His Son, Jesus Christ.
