

From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Recently, I re-read the book *Time for God* by Fr. Jacques Philippe. It is a small 108 page book that is really a great introduction to prayer. The book gives a wonderful testimony to our need for prayer and helps me to reclaim the reality that prayer is not a set of techniques that follow one another but is rather a grace where I commune with God. In it, the author writes, “Time given to God is not time stolen from other people.” Rather “fidelity in being present to God guarantees the capacity to be present to others and love them truly. Experience proves this: the love of prayerful souls is the most attentive, delicate, disinterested, sensitive to other people’s suffering, and capable of consoling and comforting. Mental prayer makes us better people, and those who are close to us won’t complain about that!” Fr. Philippe goes on to say that progress in prayer is actually progress in love and that we put our prayer into practice by loving others. The only way that we can be truly motivated to pray is by love. We must have within us a desire to love God and to let Him lead our life. In this movement of the heart, we desire His Presence and Peace to order our lives.

This week in prayer I was given a very specific grace to see a way that I had slowly over time allowed myself to become overly focused on some things in the world. Through prayer I was able to talk to Jesus about why I was doing the things I was doing and be purified in my intentions. I didn’t necessarily need to change anything major, but slowly I was allowing something in my life to rob me of peace and lose my intentional love for the Lord by paying too much attention elsewhere. This is how prayer shapes us and molds us into living our daily life for the Lord. Though it is not always easy to be purified in this way, I am ultimately much happier and more fulfilled than I would be living for the anxieties of this world.

I need to share with you something that has come about in my life. I need to make public that starting this January Bishop Quinn has asked me to begin an online degree program of study. It will be easy for you (and was at first for me) to say this is just one more thing I’m being asked to do and argue at the unreasonable nature of it, but let me tell you why I am actually looking forward to the opportunity. First of all I have committed as part of my discipline of life to regular study as a part of living a healthy priestly life. It has been way too easy to sidetrack this with the excuse that I am too busy. By taking one course a semester online and then reporting for about three weeks in the summer, this will force me to build some time of study into my week. Secondly, the degree program that I am undertaking is in pastoral theology in the New Evangelization. The degree is called an STL (Licentiate in Sacred Theology) and is conferred by the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome (the Angelicum) through the faculty of Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit (where I received my graduate degree).
