From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

On this second Sunday of Lent, we have the Transfiguration as the Gospel reading. This is an incredible moment that is sometimes overlooked in the life of Jesus. This is prayed as the 4th Luminous mystery of the Rosary and is a reminder to all of us of how Jesus is transformed before and reveals Himself as Divine. It is the great encouragement of hope to Peter, James, and John who were on the mountain with him. Though they don't fully understand the significance at that very moment, Peter writes in his own letter about this moment years later. In 2 Peter chapter 1; verses 16-19 the Sacred author writes as follows,

“I shall also make every effort to enable you always to remember these things after my departure. We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that unique declaration came to him from the majestic glory, “This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased.” We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain. Moreover, we possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.”

Peter is clearly speaking about the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor and is speaking about the impact it had for the rest of his own ministry. During Lent, we are making the journey of ascent to the mountain not of the Lord's glory but of Golgotha, the place of the skull where Jesus will be crucified. Yet, rather than this being a horrific moment, it is when the Father is glorified as the Son of Man is lifted up for our salvation. Let's pray to receive the grace of Jesus' glory to shine in our dark places.

This past week we organized our plans and registrations for the youth to attend Catholic Heart Work Camp, Steubenville North, and Camp Summit. These three camps are really important opportunities for our youth to experience the faith in a fresh way. I would like to again encourage that after a very positive first year of attending these camps/events, you would consider sending your son or daughter. You might have to encourage them or talk them into it but I am convinced deeply about the experience they will have on these trips. In order for our faith to speak into our day to day lives and to have any meaning at all, I am convinced that these types of experiences are necessary for our youth to truly realize the depth of God's love and the manner in which He wants to be at work in our lives. There is still time to sign up for all of these summer events!




Adult Faith Formation Opportunities
