From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

While I was away for ten days to Rome, it was an incredible time of grace and an experience I will not forget, leading 27 students through the cobblestone streets of the eternal city was not extremely restful! I am grateful to have a couple days with a priest friend this week and will return next weekend for some consistency in the parishes. I would like to thank those who came to our initial visioning meeting for the Faith Formation Program this past Tuesday evening. It was quite productive for an initial meeting and we were able to form two committees to evaluate how we can better train and support our catechists and also curriculum for the current situation. Please pray for this process as we seek out how to best educate, form, and encourage our youth to fall in love with Jesus Christ and the Church He founded in our faith formation program.

Thank you for welcoming Fr. George Mangalapilly who comes to us from the Diocese of Satna, India. Fr. George works in this diocese where the total population is 11 million but only 2,817 Catholics. Most of the population is Hindu and some Muslim. The tribal and caste system is still present. The Diocese has 75 priests, 147 Religious Sisters, 2 Religious Brothers actively working in 28 mission stations. They also have 19 Major Seminarians studying for the diocese. Among these, they currently serve 37 schools, 6 dispensaries, 1 Hospital, 1 Orphanage, and 2 Homes for the mentally challenged and one Home for the physically challenged children and one home for the street girls who have no one in this world to rely on. In addition to these they do incredible other works in the area to care for many areas where people live in vulnerable situations. Their work is invaluable to the cause of evangelization in India.

Maintenance of missionary personnel in the mission

Maintenance of the diocesan seminarians. There are 19 major seminarians and 18 minor seminarians.

Assistance for poor children for their studies through the boarding for the boys and girls.

For different social work activities especially tribal and rural areas.

Establishing new centers for missionary work and establishing "community of disciples of Christ".

Thank you for your generosity in this mission of the Church and for your welcome of Fr. George.

In the city of Lanciano, *Italy*, around the year 700 AD there was a priest plagued by a doubt as to whether the consecrated Host was truly the Body of Christ, and the consecrated wine truly His Blood.

One morning, as he was celebrating Mass, his doubts and errors weighed upon him more heavily than ever. By a most singular and marvelous grace, he saw the Bread changed into Flesh and the wine into Blood.

Today twelve centuries after the miraculous occurrence, it remains intact, a sustained miracle! Upon a superficial examination, the Host of Flesh, which is still in one piece and has retained the dimensions of the original "Large Host", has a fibrous appearance and a brown color.

Local Church and Vatican official have authenticated the Eucharistic miracle on many occasions since the middle ages.

A rigorous scientific analysis was performed in 1970-71 by Professor Dr. Odorardo, University Professor in anatomy and pathological histology and in chemistry and clinical microscopy, Head Physician of the United Hospitals of Arezzo. Prof. Linoli was assisted by Prof. Dr. Ruggero Bertelli, a Professor Emeritus of anatomy at the University of Si-

The research done on the fragments of the Blood and the Flesh yielded the following results:

- The Blood of the Eucharistic Miracle is real blood and the Flesh is real flesh.
- The Flesh consists of the muscular tissue of the myocardium (heart wall).
- The Blood and the Flesh belong to the human species.
- The blood type is identical in the Blood and in the Flesh, type AB.
- The proteins in the blood are in the same proportions as those found in normal fresh blood.

There is no trace whatsoever of any materials or agents used for preservation of flesh or blood.

Science, when called to testify, has confirmed what we have believed in Faith and what the Catholic Church has taught for the last 2,000 years; echoing the words of Christ, "My Flesh is real food; my Blood real drink. Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood dwells continually in Me and I dwell in him."-John 6:56-57
