From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This past week Fr. Vogel and I took 37 parishioners on a two day pilgrimage to the Apparition site of Our Lady of Good Help and the Shrine of our Lady of Guadalupe. It was a beautiful couple of days to pray and seek the assistance of the Blessed Virgin Mary in our faith journey. The Lord blessed the days with joy and peace that only He can give. I was once again struck deeply at the site our Lady appeared in 1859 to a young woman named Adele Brise instructing her to pray for the conversion of sinners, to pray the rosary, and then to instruct the youth in the faith. Our Lady told Adele that she would assist her with the grace to carry it out if only she would begin to organize plans to teach the youth their catechism. While there, I felt a deep call to entrust to Our Lady of Good Help our own parish plans to form and educate our youth in the faith. I felt a sense of confidence in the intercession of Our Lady who brings about the work of God in our day! My heart is full of trust as we move forward in planning for the future of faith formation in our tri-parish. Here is a prayer from a prayer card from the Apparition site:

O Dear Lady of Good Help,
You revealed yourself as the Queen of Heaven to your servant Adele. You gave her a mission to pray for the conversion of sinners, to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to others and to prepare the children for the reception of the sacraments.

I trust that as you called Adele to holiness, you are calling me, in my station in life, to live a holy life, devoted to Jesus Christ with the help of your maternal love.

I bring before you now my worries and anxieties. I abandon my attachments to them and place them at your feet.

I ask you to hear the deepest longings of my heart as I pray most earnestly for: _____ (your intention).

Dear Lady, you told Adele and you say to all of us "Do not be afraid; I will help you." Help me now as I place this intention with complete confidence and trust. Amen.

I encourage you to bring your worries or anxieties to Our Lady and allow her to show you the way forward. I have utmost confidence in her to assist especially in times of need. Please pray for me daily through our good mother's intercession. This coming week I am blessed to celebrate the anniversary of my ordination. Thank you for the love and support you all show me as your priest. I realize these are not the simplest or easiest of times but your continued love and support encourages me along the way! The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary are my greatest solace and confidence. Might we all continue to place our hopes in the Lord Jesus who protects and sanctifies His Church.

Feast of St. Anthony of Padua June 13

In 1224, St. Francis entrusted his friars' pursuits of studies to St. Anthony. Anthony had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students and, in a time when a printing press was not yet invented, he greatly valued it. When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole Anthony's valuable book. When Anthony discovered it was missing, he prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief *did* return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well.

So simple and resounding was his teaching of the Catholic Faith, most unlettered and the innocent could understand his messages. It is for this reason he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

He was only 36-years-old when he died and was canonized less than one year afterward by Pope Gregory IX. Upon exhumation some 336 years after his death, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. He is typically depicted with a book and the Infant Child Jesus and is commonly referred to today as the "finder of lost articles."



Sunday Bible Reflections with Dr. Scott Hahn

In this Sunday's readings we are like the fallen king, David, and the woman who weeps at Jesus' feet.

Like David, the Lord has rescued us from sin and death, anointed us with His Spirit in baptism and in confirmation. He has made us heirs of His promise to the children of Israel.

And like David, and like the woman in the Gospel, we fall into sin. Our crimes may not be as grave as David's (see [2 Samuel 11:1-26](#)) or as "many" as that woman's (see [Luke 7:47](#)).

But we often squander the great gift of salvation we've been given. Often we fail to live up to the great calling of being sons and daughters of God.

The good news of today's readings, the good news of Jesus Christ, is that we can return to God in the sacrament of confession. Each of us can repeat Paul's wondrous words in this week's Epistle: "The Son of God has loved me and given himself up for me."

Our faith will save us, as Jesus tells the woman today. Our faith that no matter how many our sins, or how serious, if we come to him in true sorrow and repentance we will hear his words of forgiveness. Like David. Like the woman in the Gospel this Sunday. We hear David's heartfelt confession in the First Reading. The Psalmist, too, confesses his sins to God. And we hear our Lord's tender words of mercy and pardon in the Gospel.

By His word of healing and his promise of peace, He makes it possible for us to join Him at the banquet table of the Eucharist. We can't be like the Pharisee in the Gospel. We should never disdain the sinner or doubt the Lord's power to convert even the worst of sinners.

Instead, we should pledge today to better imitate that sinful woman. In gratitude for the debt we've been forgiven, let us promise to live by faith and for God alone. Like her, let us devote our lives to serving Him with great love.

Jesus loves us so much. Let His love fill your marriage with new life. The next **Worldwide Marriage Encounter Weekends** are Sep 30-Oct 2, 2016 in Mankato, MN and Feb 17-19, 2017 in Windom, MN.
