From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Thank you for welcoming Fr. Jim Russell, a senior priest of the Diocese of Winona to our parish this week. Fr. Russell has generously agreed to cover two weekends while I am away this week at the Steubenville North Youth Conference and then in Poland for World Youth Day in two weeks. Thanks Fr. Russell and thanks to all of you for your loving support of the priesthood. The Steubenville North Conference in Rochester, MN is a youth conference for high school aged youth which creates an atmosphere for an invitation to spiritual growth. For some this means entering into a personal relationship with God for the first time. For others, this means a deeper and more mature acceptance of the gospel and the Church and a greater zeal to be a witness for Christ.

The conference weekend is about developing the gifts given at Baptism and sealed at Confirmation. It's about hearing dynamic speakers instruct and challenge teens in: prayer, chastity, service, and the power of the sacraments. The goal is for them to discover that Christianity is not for the weak and timid; it is not a crutch; and it is not boring! It is about meeting hundreds of people on fire for the Lord: laughing, crying, talking, singing, praying, dancing and being encouraged to take a stand for Christ. Please keep our youth in your prayers this weekend.

On Wednesday of this week I will leave for World Youth Day in Krakow, Poland. I will return late on August 2nd. I will be traveling with 27 pilgrims from the Diocese of Winona. Please keep us in your prayers for this time of pilgrimage. I encourage you to follow the happenings by watching EWTN as they will have a lot of coverage of this world wide Catholic event with Pope Francis. The dates where Pope Francis will be in Poland and the coverage will be the best are July 27-31st. It is usual that around a million young people gather from around the world for this event. It is truly remarkable and moving to see the youth of the whole world alive and in love with Jesus and His Church. I look forward to being able to share about these events upon my return to our parishes.

Sunday Bible Reflections with Dr. Scott

Though we be "but dust and ashes," we can presume to draw near and speak boldly to our Lord, as Abraham dares in this week's First Reading.

But even Abraham—the friend of God (see [Isaiah 41:8](#)), our father in the faith (see [Romans 4:12](#))—did not know the intimacy that we know as children of Abraham, heirs of the blessings promised to his descendants (see [Galatians 3:7,29](#)).

The mystery of prayer, as Jesus reveals to His disciples in this week's Gospel, is the living relationship of beloved sons and daughters with their heavenly Father. Our prayer is pure gift, made possible by the "good gift" of the Father—the Holy Spirit of His Son. It is the fruit of the New Covenant by which we are made children of God in Christ Jesus (see [Galatians 4:6-7](#); [Romans 8:15-16](#)).

Through the Spirit given to us in Baptism, we can cry to Him as our Father—knowing that when we call He will answer. Jesus teaches His disciples to persist in their prayer, as Abraham persisted in begging God's mercy for the innocent of Sodom and Gomorrah.

For the sake of the one just Man, Jesus, God spared the city of man from destruction (see [Jeremiah 5:1](#); [Isaiah 53](#)), "obliterating the bond against us," as Paul says in this week's Epistle. On the Cross, Jesus bore the guilt of us all, canceled the debt we owed to God, the death we deserved to die for our transgressions. We pray as ones who have been spared, visited in our affliction, saved from our enemies.

We pray always a prayer of thanksgiving, which is the literal meaning of Eucharist. We have realized the promise of this week's Psalm: We worship in His holy temple, in the presence of angels, hallowing His name.

In confidence we ask, knowing that we will receive, that He will bring to completion what He has done for us—raising us from the dead, bringing us to everlasting life along with Him.
