From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This last week we celebrated All Saints Day which sings the praise of God on behalf of all those who dwell in Heaven. They have finished the race and competed well. They have undergone their final purification both in the trials of this life and in purgatory where they are purified for the punishment that is owed to them because of their sins. They now live in union with God in the peace of fullness of life with their Creator. The next day we celebrated All Souls Day in which the entire Church pray for those who are in purgatory undergoing that final purification. Purgatory is a doctrine of the Church where we understand that while Jesus died to save us from eternal death and to free us from the guilt of our sins, we are still in need of purifying our souls from their disordered attachments to this life and to undergo the punishments our sins deserve. While Jesus died to take away our guilt, we must participate fully in that remission of sin and punishment through purification of our souls. This is why purgatory is the gateway to Heaven—those who enter purgatory are on the way to Heaven. They are undergoing the final purification to be perfect to dwell with God who is perfect. The month of November is often called the month of the holy souls or poor souls. This month we pray for those souls in purgatory who are suffering purification so that they might enter into eternal life. The Church has always prayed for the deceased and even the Jews in their own tradition would pray for the dead. Eternal rest grant unto them Oh Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Please celebrate with me and keep in your prayers this Sunday the 17 juniors from our Tri-Parish along with 15 from the Tri-Parish of Wells, Easton, & MN Lake who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation today (Sunday). Bishop Quinn will be the celebrant for the Mass. As they prepared, I reminded the juniors of the way sacramental grace works. While God's gifts of grace are free flowing and enter our souls by His generosity and goodness, we can be more (or less) disposed or available to the flowing of His grace in our life. If we pay no attention to God or think of Him very little we are not as open to His Presence. If we sin by offending God or neighbor we put blocks to His grace which seeks to keep us in full communion (relationship) with Him. If we sin mortally, meaning we offend God by sinning with serious (grave) sin, with knowledge that it is wrong, and still consent to doing to it willfully we completely block ourselves from the love of God and His grace works by pricking our conscience through the gift of reason to turn us away from sin and back to God. Sacramental grace then while the Sacraments always work, they always confer grace (i.e. those who receive the Sacrament of Confirmation will really be sealed with the Holy Spirit) the grace cannot flow in the life of the person receiving the Sacrament—it cannot be fully unleashed in them until they are disposed and open to grace. They will have been Confirmed but they will not be utilizing the grace because of the blockage of sin. The same is true of every Sacrament, so I always encourage couples to go to Confession before getting married and why each of us should seek Confession before receiving the Eucharist unworthily. The Sacraments are amazing gifts that Jesus Himself established and the Church has safeguarded. Might we never take them for granted.

On November 9th the Church celebrates the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome, not St. Peter's Basilica as so many mistakenly believe. The Basilica is also called the Church of Holy Savior or the Church of St. John Baptist. In ancient Rome this was the church where everyone was baptized. It the oldest church in the West, built in the time of Constantine and was consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324. This feast became a universal celebration in honor of the archbasilica, the ecclesiastical mother church, called "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" (*omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput*), as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.
