From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

As I enter into retreat this week my heart is filled with gratitude to the Lord for all the blessings that He continues to bestow in my life. It is easy to dwell on negatives or difficulties and even faults whether they be personal or other people's that affect us. Yet, when we slow down and acknowledge the many good things in our lives we really do have so much to be grateful about. While I had to miss the ecumenical service this year for Thanksgiving in our communities and was gone for Thanksgiving Day itself, my heart is full of gratitude for all that God is doing in my life. I am very blessed to be a priest and to serve our parishes. It is important for us to slow down and acknowledge the gifts we have been given. For me personally, the pace of life I keep at times prevents me from expressing how grateful I am. It prevents me from processing all the incredible graced moments that enter my life. It prevents me from enjoying time with the people who have come to mean so much to me. Yet, while this is true in some respects, it is not true in every respect. We have time for what we make time for. We have time for the things that are most meaningful if we make the time for these people and things. I spend an hour of prayer before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament every day because I know that my whole life is dependent on living in Communion with Him. My priesthood and truly my life does not make sense if I do not make Jesus the center of all my activity and ministry. I also am blessed to spend time with many wonderful people I work with and associate with regularly. I am blessed with enriching friendships and family members who love me. I am blessed with the kindness, support, and friendship of many parishioners and young adults at the Newman Center. I am blessed to journey through life with all of you whether it be regular Sunday Mass, funerals, weddings, or other events and happenings. Thank you for all you do for our Tri-Parish but even more for the Kingdom of God through your own family and sphere of influence.

As we end the Liturgical Year and prepare for Advent and Christmas to follow we are abundantly blessed to know God is near and desires to draw ever nearer to us. It is impossible to guess how long I will be the pastor here, but I do need to be sure to say thank you for following my lead, while not always perfect. I hope you are able to see the blessings God has bestowed upon our communities and lives. Even if things aren't perfect, we must strive forward, pressing on to carry out God's will for His Church. Beginning on November 27, the first Sunday of Advent, at 10 a.m. at St. Teresa and continuing on each of the Sundays in Advent, Fr Kern will expose the Eucharist on the Altar and begin the time of Adoration. Adoration will then continue until 10 p.m.

Sunday, December 11 Gaudete Sunday "Rejoice in the Lord always"

The third Sunday in Advent, Gaudete Sunday, provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation—especially prayer and fasting—for Christmas. It is a time of rejoicing as we near the coming of the Lord.

To celebrate this day we will have a special time of prayer and music and a short presentation by Fr. Kern during adoration, 11:00 a.m. to noon.
There is a breakfast at St. Teresa that day so you can stay for breakfast and then stay to rejoice in the Lord!



This weekend at each church there will be Advent wreaths, candles, and the Magnificat Advent Companion available to help with your advent preparations for the coming of Christ at Christmas.
