From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This weekend the Beatitudes are put before us for our reflection. I think sometimes we view the Beatitudes as sort of pie in the sky thinking. They might often be perceived as something transcendent or distant or a lofty idea that we should strive after but sometimes we forget the immediate context of how Jesus meant them. The Beatitudes are spoken by Jesus on the Mount. From this same mount, Jesus will send the apostles to the ends of the world to proclaim God's Kingdom. This is all significant as Jesus is leading the people in a new exodus but not like Moses needed to lead the people out of slavery to a worldly reign in the Egyptians, but Jesus has come to lead the people out from under the reign of sin. So, the Beatitudes are meant to serve as a new law for the people living now under the reign of God. These are the laws of the Kingdom of God. They are meant for us to live in fulfillment and freedom as God's children. Not only then do the Beatitudes fulfill the law given to the people from Moses they also fulfill the promise of God's blessings given to Abraham. By living this new law we are in union with God as inheriting the fullness of His blessings upon us.

God doesn't come to reward the mighty and powerful of the earth. He doesn't come to give honors and accolades to those who have won the military honors. He doesn't come to give celebrity status or fame or glory. He comes to reward the weak and lowly. Those who are foolish and despised in the eyes of the world are who God wants to raise up with His blessedness. The poor in spirit are the key indicator for the whole set of Beatitudes—those who look only to God's mercy and love for their strength and do not think they can merit it on their own accomplishments. The poor in spirit are those who seek refuge in the name of the Lord.

The Beatitudes reveal the divine path and purpose for our lives. All our striving should be for these virtues—to be poor in spirit; meek and clean of heart; merciful and makers of peace; seekers of the righteousness that comes from living by the law of the eternal Kingdom.

The path the Lord sets before us today is one of trials and persecution. But He promises comfort in our mourning and a great reward.

The Kingdom we have inherited is no earthly territory, but the promised land of heaven. It is Zion where the Lord reigns forever. And, as we sing in today's Psalm, its blessings are for those whose hope is in the Lord.

Thursday, Feb. 2, is the Presentation of the Lord. This feast celebrates the day Jesus first appeared in the temple as Mary and Joseph took him, as prescribed by

Mosaic Law, to be presented and for the Purification of Mary, 40 days after Christ's birth. In the early Church this was a major Feast Day. You can celebrate this feast by attending Mass, offered at 8:30 a.m. at St. Teresa Church.

In obedience to the Old Law, the Lord Jesus, the first-born, was presented in the Temple by his Blessed Mother and his foster father. This is another 'epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess. Christ is the light of the nations, hence the (traditional) blessing and procession of candles on this day.
