From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This week we are called and challenged to be the light of the world! We can not settle for putting our light under a bushel basket. Often when we hear this we think of the talents or gifts that we individually have been given. I often like to reflect on not only do we tend to not share our gifts at times but we reserve our love. We reserve love for those we trust and are confident wont hurt us. However, if we are truly going to build and form a city that cannot be hidden—we need everyone! We need you—your gifts, talents, and generosity of heart and soul—to be shared with our community and with the community that surrounds us. Every light that is either dimmed, darkened, or disappears is one less light to captivate and shine before the world. You matter to God and you matter to each other and you matter to me. However, we don't exist for ourselves—we don't exist just for our own communities either. We exist to radiate the glory of God. This means that the way our lights grow in brightness is for us to be filled with the glory of God. Our light diminishes when we allow sin and worldliness to smug our shine. Do you let joy radiate? I heard a priest ask once, “are you joyful?” If you want to know if you are a joyful person, turn to your spouse or your children or those closest to you, and ask—am I a joyful person? They will tell you if you are a joyful person or not!” Joy is not fleeting happiness—it is an interior reality that persists because we experience the art of living and the joy of life. Joy has to start beyond us and live in us. It comes from being loved by God and others and finding our identity in God and in communion with others as opposed to surface level or worldly pleasures. We are made for this type of interior joy and freedom—this is what it means to let our light shine. We radiate the love of God in our lives and we learn the way of sharing that love with others. Every day you are somewhere where God’s love and light are sorely needed. If we allow one day to pass without sharing that joy we have missed a time of sharing God’s love.

This week we will offer a blessing to those traveling on the mission trip to Belize! I am very excited for the group to leave next weekend and head down for the 2nd year in a row to not only serve the poor and encounter the needs of the greater world, but for them to meet Jesus in the poor and to be ministered to by Jesus Himself. When we go on mission trips we think we are going to go do some good and make the world a little bit better place. And while this is perhaps somewhat true, the little good we do is often not nearly as transformative as the encounters we have with people and experiencing the joy and love the world has even in places where they lack even basic material goods. I am proud our Tri-Parish has this mission opportunity and thank Carol Cyr for the hard work she does to plan and organize the details that surround it—but I am much more excited for the people going on the trip to be able to encounter the living God in their encounters with others, in the graces they will receive, and in the sacrifices they’ll make during their time. May God be with them and may our prayers sustain and strengthen them in the week ahead!

Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes—Feb. 11

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in the apostolic constitution *Ineffabilis Deus*. A little more than three years later, on February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 25, the lady identified herself with the words: “I am the Immaculate Conception.”

During the ninth of her 18 different appearances to Bernadette that year, our Lady of Lourdes, as Mary became known in association with these events, had the girl dig up a spring of water where none had been found before. The water flowing from this spring, although pure, did not have any extraordinary scientific or medical properties. It has nonetheless been the source of countless miraculous cures for 150 years!


