From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Last weekend was a heavy and emotional weekend for me. After Easter the weekend prior and after announcing that I am leaving the Tri-Parish and Newman Center I still had first communion and then 17 students entering into the Catholic Church at the Newman Center with Bishop Quinn coming for the Mass. I am not sure I have been as emotionally drained as that since the time of my own mother's passing. While the emotions were different then being only sorrow and grief, this time it is mixed with sorrow at leaving, but gratitude for all that God has blessed me with in my time here, and joy at the present first communions and young people entering the Catholic Church. It's been a lot to process in prayer. While I am sad to leave, I know that God's providence and will guides and directs the future. The Lord had a plan for me to be the pastor here for four years and He has a plan for me for the next part of my life. He has a plan to bring in a different priest and use His gifts to lead you deeper in the Catholic faith and in communion with Jesus. You will always be a part of my life and my prayers. They say a priest always maintains a special love and affection for the first place he becomes the pastor of and that will be especially true for me always. We have nearly exactly two months left, but even now I am most grateful for the four years we have spent together.

Some of you have asked what my role will be exactly. And while I have a huge learning curve before I will fully understand it, the Director of Vocations for a diocese works to promote, encourage, and engage future vocations to the priesthood and also to consecrated life. As Fr. Will Thompson has done previously I will travel around and preach at parishes on the topic of Vocations. Fr. Will also spent a lot of time on the road with the Newman Centers, Catholic high schools, and parish faith formation programs talking with youth about the priesthood and consecrated life. This is not to forget marriage as a way to holiness but marriage though a beautiful way is also the natural way. The call to priesthood and religious life is a call from God and in that way is a supernatural call. Especially in the busyness and noise of this culture, there is a special need to promote this way of life and help young people hear God's voice amid so many other voices. I will work closely with the Bishop in helping men take those steps toward the priesthood. Once in the seminary, I will still have a direct role in the formation of the men toward the priesthood. The Vocations Director for our diocese along with the Rector of the seminary reports to the Bishop about a candidates readiness to continue in formation and where he is working to grow. In this way, Bishop Quinn has assigned me as faculty to IHM Seminary in addition to my role as Vocations Director and so I will get to know the guys well and be intentional in building future priests for our diocese and for all the dioceses that send men to IHM Seminary in Winona. This is a most important task as the formation demands much of the men in their pursuit of holiness and growth in their human, intellectual, spiritual, and pastoral dimensions of serving in the Church. Thank you for your prayers in this and know of my gratitude to all of you for all you have done for me and with me in these years. →

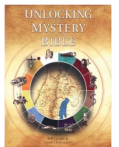
