From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

I have been renewed in hope this Easter season as I continue to meditate on the truth of my humanity being redeemed in Jesus Christ. What does it mean to say we live redemption? How is it that humanity is raised up in hope through Jesus Christ. There is a new movie on Netflix called “Liberating a Continent” which is the story of how Saint Pope John Paul II brought the hope of Jesus Christ alive into a culture (Poland and really all eastern Europe) that had been beaten down by both the soviet and communist regimes. It is remarkable how in the midst of such depravity and stripping away of man’s reasons for hope and optimism, such incredible grace can be borne and flourish as a people rally around truth, beauty, and the oneness of life in Christ. As a Tri-Parish we can lose heart in the midst of trials or transitions but even from the freshness of spring and the farmers getting to work in the fields to the truth that time and history marches forward, I am confident in God’s plan of redemption and the work of grace that is taking place here and now to bring about a New Dawn of Jesus Christ in the hearts of believers. Do not lose hope, be not afraid to continue to open wide the doors of your hearts, of our parishes, of our workplaces, our schools, and our homes to Jesus Christ. When we give ourselves to Jesus, we lose nothing, no nothing, but we gain everything. We gain life. We gain hope. May Jesus be the cause of our optimism even where there is nothing earthly to give us joy.

Over the next couple weekends we will have May Crowning and Baccalaureate Mass. As things conclude at the Newman Center this week I am making a few final goodbyes and departing for a final mission trip with 15 students this Sunday. I will return next Saturday evening. We will celebrate our Mother Mary by crowning her statue and showing veneration for her role in the salvation of all. May our loving Mother in Heaven intercede for us! Additionally Baccalaureate Masses will take place to pray for our graduating seniors who are transitioning to a next stage of life. May God be with them on the journey.

This weekend I will begin a conversation at Mass about the need to keep supporting the sacred sites where we lay our deceased in repose. The cemeteries in each of our communities are in lovely shape and have been consistently cared for over the years by faithful members of our parishes. Even more, Catholic cemeteries are consecrated/blessed ground. It is considered a sacred space. I would ask that you remember them as each year the cost of mowing and maintenance is there and while a few donations trickle in, it is a spiritual and corporal work of mercy to be sure we pray for the deceased and also bury the dead—part of that means that we care for the property. Thank you for considering a gift toward our cemeteries.

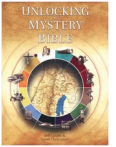
