From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Blessed Mother's Day to all the lovely mothers in our communities. Thank you for your 'Yes' to life and to love in this world. We have so much to be grateful to you for the sacrifices and generosity you have shown to us. Thanks for all the nurturing, caring, and encouraging you do in this world.

While we think of our own mother's this weekend, we also must turn our minds to our heavenly Mother, Mary! On Saturday, May 13th the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. This year it is of particular importance as it is the 100th anniversary of the apparition of our Lady to three young children. This momentous occasion carries significance for numerous reasons:

While it is definitely worth reading about all that took place in the appearances of Mary at Fatima, the reality of Mary appearing and the mystery behind that reality is not the point of the appearance. It was the message that was given to the three shepherd children that was most vital for the Church and the world.

Mary asked the children to spread devotion to the Immaculate Heart, pray for the conversion of sinners (the children were given a vision of hell and saw the poor souls in eternal torment), and to do penance on behalf of sinners. The visions have so many insights into the 20th Century marked by war and violence. Our Lady warned that if we failed to pray for peace and repent, the errors of Communism and specifically communist Russia would dominate the world. Thanks be to God for Our Lady's intercession in defeating this heinous reality. Pope John Paul II consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart after his assassination attempt in 1981. On May 13th 1981 (note the date is the feast of Our Lady of Fatima) in St. Peter's Square in the Vatican a bullet just missed the heart of Pope John Paul II. The Pope attributed his survival to our Lady and would later state that one hand guided the gun but another hand guided the bullet attributing his survival to our Lady. He would then place the bullet in her crown at Fatima. There is so much more than these simple details to the whole story.

Take time to read about Our Lady of Fatima, an approved apparition in the Catholic Church and visited and revered by millions of people. Pope Francis canonized two of the children on Saturday this week to celebrate the occasion. New saints, Francisco and Jacinta are the youngest non-martyr saints in the Church's history. Pretty amazing how the apparitions assisted them to live their Catholic faith and witness to the whole Church the truth of prayer and penance as a way to draw both themselves and others to God through Mary. On this the feast of our Lady of Fatima, may our Lady intercede for you and your family to be drawn to Christ and His holy Church.
