Pre-Baptism preparation is required. Please contact the office at least one month before the desired date.

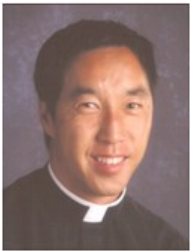
The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick Please notify the office if you or a family member is in the hospital or homebound and would like a pastoral visit.

Hello,

Love of Jesus and the Truth of the Catholic Church is alive and well!! To those who sent their kids to Steubenville Rochester this past weekend, thank you. It was absolutely amazing to watch 1800 teens worshipping Jesus, especially in the Blessed Sacrament in Eucharistic Adoration. I wish all of you could see it. It is an amazing and beautiful sight to behold. Often I'm asked about the future of the Catholic Church. I can tell you, the future is bright. We are in a new springtime of the Church. The New Evangelization called for by Saint Pope John Paul II, is getting ramped up.

This week we have Totus Tuus in our parishes. If you have not signed up yet, please do so...or just show up on the first day. The teens will start Sunday evening and the elementary grade kids will start Monday morning. Totus Tuus is an amazing opportunity for our kids to not just learn more about Jesus and Mary, but to encounter them. If you are at all on the fence, I would strongly urge you to send your kids for at least a day and then evaluate what you think. I know summers can be super busy, but this has to do with eternity.

Also, still coming up is Camp Summit for junior high. If you want your kids to get out and away from their phones and do something active, this is a great opportunity to get them to do some active activities.

In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about the enemy who sows weeds among the good seed. Sometimes we are the weeds, sometimes we are the good seed. Sometimes we "infect" those around us for the good, and sometimes we "infect" those around us for evil. We need to be thankful for God's mercy, forgiveness, and patience. We need to be thankful that God gives us multiple chances. But someday those chances are going to end, maybe sooner rather than later. Maybe at an unexpected time. None of us knows how long we really have. And once we die and make our eternal decision, that's it. So we need to repent of the evil in our lives, myself included, and make sure we are the good seed. We need to make sure we are "infecting" those around us for good and with the grace of God.
